At the writing of these words, we are suffering with Miriam Richards and Samantha Alexander as they mourn the passing of husband and father, George. Let us keep them in our prayers and thoughts as they try to find consolation and peace in this difficult part of their journey. And while the death of George Richards saddens us, let me share the joy we had during the third Sunday in October when we baptized a three-month old baby, Nixon Barrington Foo, son of Dwayne and Ashley and grandchild of Margaret and Errol. We enjoyed the company of a nice group of relatives and friends that made this celebration indeed special. And as you can notice, life can take us within a few days from the joy of baptizing of a baby, reminding us of the beginning of life, to the grieving of a love one whose journey left remarkable memories of love, compassion, and generosity among relatives and a congregation.

The Hempstead Fellowship Brunch (HFB) offered for the sixth time this year a very delicious and healthy hot meal in the month of October. Since we began serving the community through this ministry, it is important to recognize the outstanding work of the Outreach Committee led by Mrs. Ruth Robinson. Their dedication and commitment has been a blessing for those persons and families who need these hot meals. Needless to say, the church accepts donation in cash. Anything that you can contribute towards this ministry will help us to keep feeding those who are hungry and in need of a warm community. On the Sunday after the HFB served around 60 persons, two of them attended our worship service. Even though our intention is not to exchange food for worship service attendance, it

is important to see that many of this people also need the spiritual food we are able to provide on Sundays. Some of you may have received a letter inviting you to be part of the November 15th worship service. The purpose of this activity is to recognize, honor, and celebrate those of you who have served our church for more than 25 years. That Sunday is also Youth Sunday and what a better way to acknowledge your great effort and commitment than with the younger generations and those who have become part of our family of faith in later years. I hope you will make every effort to be part of what we hope promise to be a memorable celebration.

Lastly, our building has finally been equipped with 24 cameras that have greatly improved the safety of all those who use the church's facilities to serve the community in different forms, including, of course, our own congregation. Equally important, and as of the writing of this article, I am glad to report that the painting of the old building has begun; we hope this project will be completed by the second week of November. We are also working to reduce the energy consumption and costs of our buildings. We have already received an energy assessment report and are working with a group of engineers from BlocPower, a Department of Energy-supported Public Benefits Corporation, to come up with a very specific plan to address the recommendations of the energy assessment report. As you pray about all this, keep in mind that your financial support for all these endeavors is not only of ultimate importance, but also an investment in your spiritual life and the life of the United Methodist Church of Hempstead.

Miriam Harris joined the UMC of Hempstead in 1989 and is a proud member of our church for the past 26 years. Prior to joining the church community, she belonged to the Greenport United Methodist Church

Greenport was Miriam's home for many years; it's the town where she grew up with her three brothers and two sisters. She fondly remembers her childhood—her mother was a Native American from the Shinnecock tribe in Long Island, and her father was born in Puerto Rico. The family made their home in Long Island. Miriam, who is 91 years young (and proud of it!), has lived her entire life in Long Island. In 1950, she married Edwin, her husband of 39 years. They were together until he died in 1989.

Her interest in dressmaking led her to the Traphagen School for fashion design in New York City where she studied all facets of dressmaking and design. "I made all my clothes, my family's clothes, and my friends' clothes," said Miriam. "I was always interested in arts and crafts, and painting too."

Eventually, Miriam began working for the U.S. Postal Service where she remained until her retirement in 1984.

Leading a full and active life, Miriam naturally became involved in some of the committees at the UMC of Hempstead. She was a member of the Social Concerns Committe, and then joined the UMW in 1990, a few years after she found this church. She was the Chair of the Esther Circle for five years, and remains active in this group.

One of Miriam's favorite memories at the UMC of Hempstead brings a smile to her face: "I really enjoyed being the Chairperson of the bake table at the annual Church Fair," she said. During this annual fundraising event, she managed sales, requested donations from people, and sold baked items on the day of the Fair.

OUGHT TO BE






VALERIE SMITH IS INAUGURATED AS FIRST AFRICAN-AMERICAN PRESIDENT OF SWARTHMORE COLLEGE

Valerie Smith, daughter of Dr. William R. Smith and Josephine Smith of the United Methodist Church of Hempstead, was recently inaugarated as the first African American president of Swarthmore College. During the inauguration, she was accompanied by her fellow presidential colleagues from Swarthmore College, Princeton University, Bates College, Haverford Collage, and Smith College.

A Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Bates College, President Smith holds M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Virginia. She is the author of more than 40 articles and three books on African-American literture, culture, film, and photography, and is the editor or co-editor of several volumes.

A native of Brooklyn, New York, President Smith is the eldest child of educators, Dr. William R. Smith, and Josephine Smith.
