In the Spotlight



Roger Tatem was born on Nov. 18, 1940 in old Mercy Hospital on Long Beach Road in Hempstead. When his father was told by the doctor that he would be born there, his father said, "That's an old fire trap." The doctor quipped, "It has not burned down yet!" And it did not.

He has been fortunate to have very few hospital visits during the course of his life. The only serious visit occurred after he fell off the side of the church while changing light bulbs. That resulted in a slight concussion and a broken finger.

As a member of the United Methodist Church of Hempstead since he was 12 years-old (63 years), he shares some memorable moments from the past: During his youth, in the 1940s, he rode on a bicycle in a Methodist Youth Fellowship production of a bicycle built for two; and enjoyed dinners downstairs in the old building. He recalls when Sunday school classes were held downstairs, in the room now used by the Senior Center, using movable dividers. The space now used as the library was the Pastor's office, and the church office was in the room now used by the acolytes. The Parish House building was built in his high school days. During Easter

sunrise service, a small organ was played outside in the parking lot.

When recalling the summer months, Roger reminisced about services that were held together with the Presbyterian church. Their Pastor would preach in this church, and the Pastor of UMC of Hempstead preached in their church. This gave both pastors vacation time off. Roger's Grandfather, ET Berg, helped to bury the tombstones in the grave yard on Washington and Front Streets. A map was saved indicating the location of the stones. This saved the front lawn from street widening by the County, redeeming Church records. Some years ago, the UMC of Hempstead traded land on Front Street for land on the north side, which was used in building the Parish House. A local undertaker from the Church, Bob Leden, saved remains found on the Front Street property and reinterred them in the "garden area" on the east side of the building. Roger, a long-time resident of Hempstead,

enjoys doing small repairs around the church, and serving as a trustee for the second time.
