More than 200 people attended this year's Mission U Conference held at the Stamford Hilton in Connecticut.

Royston Bailey, president of the UMM, and member of the United Methodist Church of Hempstead, had the opportunity to attend this worthwhile event.

Supportive! A role model! An honorable dean




