REFLECTIONS: A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR



Easter is now upon us and with it the wonderful mystery of the force of life that sprouts in springtime, expressing in all its magnificent forms, shapes, colors, manifestations, and the undeniable presence of sacredness and reverence. But it also reminds us that life never gives up; it is always seeking to expand and ready to accept the challenge of death by being transformed again into beautiful life. In this, we Christians have a breathtaking image, a powerful metaphor of what the resurrection experience meant for the first Christian communities, and for those who have continued to build on that experience of the resurrected Christ over the centuries—which now includes us at Hempstead.

I witnessed some sparks of resurrection life when we got together during the Lenten suppers. I heard laughs and saw smiles; I also noticed faces expressing thanksgiving for the meals and fellowship. Some of us indulged not just with desserts but also with companionship built on story sharing and listening. I learned from those with whom I had the opportunity to chat that life is a constant struggle for all of us. Recognizing how much we have received as an expression of gratitude gives us the strength to move on and be faithful to the journey of helping to build God's kingdom. Yes! Indeed! Those Wednesdays were long days; full days of working and driving and commuting, but also days promising a deeper faith built on loving and caring relationships in Christ.

I perceived something similar at the Easter Egg Hunt. It was not just about giving food or toys or gifts to children but about creating a sacred and recreational space for so many alienated families in our community: mothers and fathers who also have to overcome so many obstacles just to make it in life. I was glad to see the caring effort of those who organized the event, cooked, served, cleaned, supervised, painted children's faces, amused them with their customs, took pictures, and did so many other things, all of them inspired by divine love and by the belief that each human being deserves respect because each one of us is a reflection of God's image. Indeed, it demanded of lot of work and time but our greatest reward was to witness so many children and parents coming all together and having good quality time together as a family, right before our own eyes.

I cannot end these thoughts without expressing my gratitude for the experiences of the International Women's Day celebration, our Hempstead Fellowship Brunch, and Easter Sunday. When our celebrations and ministry help us to move to a higher level of consciousness of what the promise of abundant life means, our life purpose becomes clearer and our faith journey meaningful. Indeed, this puts us in the path of spiritual growth. I hope we can continue to build on these experiences that I think bring us closer as friends, as brothers and sister in Christ, and as a community of believers working collectively to expand life wherever we are present—and certainly closer to the God of our friend, brother, and companion, Jesus Christ. Happy Easter!





Did You Know?

Talking Books: Launched in 1933 and sponsored by the Library of Congress, the National Library Service (NLS) for the Blind and Physically Handicapped (NLS) is a national network of cooperating libraries that distribute recorded books to people with vision loss.

These books are loaned and mailed **free of charge**, and are played on machines provided by the NLS program. The books come in special containers that are mailed back free of charge. Talking Books can also be downloaded from the Braille and Audio Reading Download website (BARD) for play on the Digital Talking Book Player via a USB thumb drive or on portable players compatible with the NLS format. 


