Native American Awareness Sunday is April 15th:

Today Native Americans—with many unique languages, many unique cultures—honor their heritage, and live as Jesus followers, led by a rotation of primarily Native American pastors. The people of The United Methodist Church, Native and non-Native, are creating a new history. Through Native American Ministries Sunday, we’re able to equip and empower Native American pastors, congregations, and seminary students to do what only they can do: authentically worship and serve Jesus.

On March 11th a special collection was taken for UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief). \$601 was received for this important ministry - **Thank You.**

Environmental Hazards of Batteries: People are using more and more household batteries. The average person owns about two button batteries, ten normal (A, AA, AAA, C, D, 9V, etc.) batteries, and throws out about eight household batteries per year. About three billion batteries are sold annually in the U.S. averaging about 32 per family or ten per person. A battery is an electrochemical device with the ability to convert chemical energy to electrical energy to provide power to electronic devices. Batteries contain heavy metals such as mercury, lead, cadmium, and nickel, which can contaminate the environment when batteries are improperly disposed of. When incinerated, certain metals might be released into the air or can concentrate in the ash produced by the combustion process. There is a box in the narthex labeled “used batteries.” Please bring yours in and we will make sure they are disposed of properly.

APRIL IS TAX MONTH: As much as we dread paying, we must remember - we all receive benefits from the taxes we pay, “Pay to Caesar what is Caesar’s, and pay to God what belongs to God”. Within this *Parish News* is a “Blessing Tax” page. It certainly does not list all our blessings but gives us pause to remember all that God has given us. When you have decided on your “Tax,” just put it in an envelope with your name and envelope number and place it in the offering plate or send to the church. The funds received will be used to help finance our ministries.


