



**Pajamas for Safe Center:** Twenty-four pairs of new pajamas were donated in November for the women at Safe Center. Thank you for your generosity.

Advent Boxes are available again this year in the Narthex. When you come home from shopping this season, put your loose change in the box. The money raised is used to support the ministries of the church. The boxes can be returned at any time and given to an usher. Pennies, nickels, dimes and quarters (bills too) add up and help us to continue the church's work.

Christmas Card Tree: Once again, you have the opportunity to send greetings to your church family through a donation to Brooklyn Methodist Hospital's Red Stocking Campaign. No one is turned away when they come to the hospital and the funds raised through Red Stocking provide new socks, underwear, etc. to those in need. Come to the Christmas Card Tree during coffee hour; make a donation and you name will go on the tree which will be displayed in the Narthex. A list of donors, sending greetings, will be in the bulletin and Parish News. This is a way of ensuring everyone in the church gets your good wishes (and you can reduce the number of cards you send).

White Christmas: On Sunday, December, 15th, the church will be celebrating White Christmas. The congregation is asked to bring wrapped toys labeled boy or girl, and age; the toys will be given to families in need. Every child should have a package or two to open Christmas morning. As you shop this season, please pick up an extra toy or two to bring on the 15th; they will be collected at the altar during service.
