REFLECTIONS: A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

The last stage of 2014 and the early journey into 2015 **I** have brought sadness to several families of our parish. Let me use this means to offer our church's condolences to George Knight, whose father, Lemuel Knight, passed away last December in Barbados, West Indies. Our hearts also go out to Claudette Powell and her family for the passing of her step-mother, Mrs. Mavis Campbell, in London, England this past December. And finally, we share the pain of the Blake family for the loss of Mabel Blake, a long-time member of our church, who left us on January 15th of this year. We ask God to grant all of them peace, love, and comfort in this difficult journey of healing.

In the tradition of justice and peace, the Committee on Religion and Race organized the Martin Luther King Jr. celebration on Sunday, January 18. The Rev. Cecil B. 


MLK ECUMENICAL SERVICE - JANUARY 18, 2015
