The year 2017 is gearing up to be another busy one for us at the United Methodist Church of Hempstead (UMCH). And the ministries of the different committees, groups, and organizations are beginning to take shape.

According to the church's records, "Hempstead's Methodist congregation was established in 1812 by the Rev. William Thatcher, an itinerant preacher on what was known as the Jamaica Circuit. Initially, services were held in private homes. When the houses became too small, the congregation moved into a rented building... The church moved to its present location in 1822."

For 195 years, the Methodist Church has been a remarkable presence in the Incorporated Village of Hempstead at the corners of Washington and Front Streets.



It is fitting that we celebrate this significant milestone at different intervals during 2017. Since May is believed to be the month of the church's inception, I am proposing that we begin our 195th celebrations on Sunday, May 21 (Please circle this date on your calendar).

Soon, there will be a committee in place to plan this year's anniversary activities. Meanwhile, I am encouraging members, family, friends, and well-wishers of UMCH to consider making this a special anniversary by contributing one dollar for each year of the church's existence (or whatever we are able to give). Ruth Robinson

Many people in the congregation know Ruth Robinson as a humble, kind, and compassionate person; the epitomy of a lady. This lovely lady has not only contributed greatly to the church and community, she has also made an impact in black history.

Ruth is a member of the UMC of Hempstead for 26 years and a resident of Hempstead for the past 20 years. To her credit, she has assisted with the UMC of Hempstead Sunday School program, volunteered wherever needed in other events and activities, and more recently, spearheaded the Hempstead Fellowship Brunch nearly two years ago with the help of her oldest son, Stephen, and Rev. Rafael Garcia. "My son worked at the INN in Hempstead, and said we could provide a program for the community and really reach out to help many people," said Ruth. "I love helping people. To see these people line up so we can comfort them and feed them for a few hours each month, is very touching and rewarding."

Prior to joining the UMC of Hempstead, she was a member of St. Paul AME Zion Church of Great Neck for 30 years; she was very

active in church and community, working with families and young people in the Manhasset area in which she lived with her family. When she moved to the area, her oldest son was two; the year was 1959. At that time, the schools were segregated but that was about to change. Together with five other parents, Ruth brought a case against the Great Neck Schools, as the schools were not teaching properly and their children were not getting a fair education. "Together with the NAACP, we won the case for our children.," said Ruth, proudly. She recalls wearing a red dress on the last day of the case, and was the first one called to the stand in the courtroom. She gave them an eloquent, passionate, and sincere message that included the words: "I do this for my children and the community. We deserve the same education as other children." The judge ruled in their favor.

After the ruling, *Newsday* came to interview Ruth and the children. It was a great moment in history, marked by great change for the future education of black children. For her tremendous efforts, Ruth was recognized with a Citation from the Nassau County Legislature, and the "Mayor's Special Service Award," presented by the Incorporated Village of Hempstead.

Ruth raised four children, three sons, and her daughter who passed away. She is blessed with five grandchildren and her first great-granddaughter, Kali Marie.

Note: February is Black History Month. Black History month first originated in 1926 as part of an initiative by writer and educator Dr. Carter G. Woodson. Since 1976, every American president has proclaimed February as Black History Month. Today, other countries such as Canada and the United Kingdom also devote an entire month to celebrating black history.


