It is an opportunity to assess our life journey experiences and see if our attitudes and behavior responded to our spiritual expectations. In this introspection, we need to display courage, honesty and the willingness to assume responsibility as the necessary requirements to move to a deeper consciousness.

As you engage in this significant spiritual exercise, I hope the new year offers you fresh opportunities to stay connected or reconnect with the source of grace and love.

The third and fourth Sunday of Advent presented an opportunity to enjoy and appreciate the work of the Sunday School children and staff, and the gifts hidden in the voices of many or our women and men. A word of thanks to Ms. Shari Bailey, our Sunday School Superintendent, and Mr. Kevin Gray, our Choir Master, for inspiring and supporting those under their ministry.

In this spirit of seeing things with fresh eyes, I hope you have noticed that our church building has been enhanced with repairs and new painting. Some of you have already expressed joy and gratitude for this accomplishment after years of neglect. With your support and donations, we were able to cover the total cost of this project of \$66,400. However, we are not finished yet because the steeple is clearly demanding a fresh touch as well. We hope the new year will give us the resources to finish this job. The trustees are searching for contractors to estimate the cost. Once we have a clearer idea of the resources needed to repair and paint

the steeple, we will start working on a capital fundraising campaign. Please stay tuned!

We are currently working on a project that will help us reduce our energy and utility costs in a significant way. With the support of the City Society of the United Methodist Church and in partnership with BlocPower, a group of engineers has prepared a very specific plan of action to implement the recommendations of the energy assessment report performed last September. Even though this project will require about \$50,000, the good news is that with the savings it generates, it will pay for itself over a period of 10 years. I am very enthusiastic about this opportunity. Keep the trustees in your prayers! Finally, we have the surveillance system of 25 cameras in full operation. It works very well and gives us a better sense of security. We hope that once the intercom system is in place, which hopefully will happen before the 2015 year end, our building will offer all the groups using our facilities a better interaction with their clients.

As we wrap up the year, let me express from the bottom of my heart, wishes of joy and peace to each one of you and your families. Pray for your pastor and for our ministry that we find, in the daily tasks of ministry, ways to deepen our spirituality, individually and as a community.




