The clergy and laity of the New York Conference came together for its 220th session of holy conferencing at Hofstra University on Thursday, June 6th through Sunday, June 9th.

"At Conference, Bishop Bickerton re-appointed Rev. Samuel to the Hempstead community as Pastor of our church," said Mary Johnson, delegate to the Conference. "He was also appointed Parish Coordinator of the West End Parish, which includes 11 churches."

Opening worship on June 6th was a time for remembrance, celebration and Holy Communion. "The important thing as we begin is that we need to worship together and to break bread," said Bishop Bickerton. "Remember, a lot has happened since we were last in this place." In his message, based on Philippians 1, the Bishop spoke about how history is often glamorized, noting that recently a few pastors had expressed a desire to return to the 50s and 60s when it was "easier to be part of a church."

Fred Brewington, laity speaker, stressed the importance of laity knowing the purpose of the church, and their mission within it as described in the Book of Discipline. "It's important for us to be on the same page when we are talking about our mission," said Brewington. He added that mission and ministry are important, and laity needs to challenge one another because there is important work to do that can't be left for others.

On Friday, Bishop Thomas J. Bickerton urged the gathering to focus on loving and caring for one another and the world as the work is done to create new pathways and possibilities for the denomination. "It's time for us to find a way forward and explore seriously what it means to 'bless and send rather than fight and rend' for the sake of the mission of the church," he said.

Following a heart-stirring outpouring of spirit through dance ministry, and a call to worship that touched every

form of servant leadership the church recognizes, guest preacher Erin Hawkins, general secretary of the General Commission on Religion and Race, invited reflection on the reality of being "called for a purpose."

In concert with the commitment of NYAC Bishop Thomas J. Bickerton to appoint pastors to communities and not simply to churches, Hawkins challenged each servant minister, both laity and clergy, to recognize that "if we want to know who God is, we have to step out into the world and be with the people of God, because we are made for community."
