REFLECTIONS: A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PASTOR



We are almost half-way into this Lenten journey. The ashes of Ash Wednesday reminded us of humbleness in our relationship with God, but in a reverse way. In other words, as people who recognize that the abundant grace of God is poured on every human being, we commit to stand with courage against hoarding by sharing; oppression, by freeing; and harming by healing. For this reason, it is imperative that all the elements that comprise our Christian identity, such as faith, love, justice, peace, and hope, are engaged in this journey of reflection and preparation.

If you still have not had an opportunity to stop by and participate in one of our Lenten suppers, I encourage you to come and experience the blessings of fellowship, along with a delicious meal prepared by our church family.
