### A Message From The Pastor's Desk



**In January,** the church received a 2016 Honor Certificate from Church World Service for the donation made in the fall for blankets.

**During March**, the UMW is asking your assistance in donating pajamas for the Safe Center. When women of abuse leave their situation they often leave with only the clothes on their backs. The pajamas not only provide sleepwear, but lounge wear during the day. All sizes are needed. This is a Christian call for help – let's do all we can.

March 26th is UMCOR Sunday: When You Give You Equip Christ's Body to Serve in His Name. That's because your generous giving to UMCOR Sunday (formerly One Great Hour of Sharing) is what allows UMCOR to act as the arms and legs of Christ's church, moving toward the most vulnerable in their darkest days. Convinced that all people have God-given worth and dignity—without regard to race, religion or gender—together we are assisting those impacted by crisis or chronic need.
