A Message From the Pastor's Desk



"Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. He fasted forty days and forty nights..." (Matthew 4:1-2, NRSV)

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We reflect on our Savior Jesus' wandering in the wilderness, tempted by Satan. Each of us goes through temptation in a personal way. Sometimes we think no one else understands what we are experiencing. But the truth is others go through what we are going through.

Lent is about examining ourselves and being reminded that we depend on God alone. To help us remember how Jesus denied himself, some people give up something during Lent. Others, recognizing all that Jesus took on for our salvation, will take on something during the season of Lent. For example, some will take on a more disciplined prayer and devotional life. And there are those who will devote more of their time to mission or other service projects.

Lenten Dinners and Reflections: During Lent we gather together for Wednesday Lenten Supper at 7pm. Just bring a dish, be it a home-made specialty, or store-bought, we love it all. There is no planned menu, except dessert is provided. It is always an adventure and a wonderful time for fellowship. At 8 pm, following dinner, there will be a half hour session in the chapel covering a Gospel lesson. UMCOR Sunday is March 22nd: A special collection will be taken to support administration costs of UMCOR. In supporting this, when a disaster happens, 100% of donations will go where it is most needed for relief of the victims.

Church World Service (CWS) Health Kit Campaign:

Watch for the HEALTH KIT collection table. When people are forced to abruptly leave their homes because

of emergencies, they may not have time to pack the things they use on a daily basis like toothbrushes or soap. But after a few days without these items, they definitely miss them. The health kit offers a refreshing daily boost for someone when supplies are hard to come by.



Last year we assembled over 100 kits to be shipped to Church World Service. Once again, we will be collecting items during coffee hour. While you are out shopping, pick up an item or two needed to complete the kits: hand towel, washcloth, wide tooth comb, fingernail/toenail clipper, bath size soap, toothbrush in original package and ten standard size Band-Aids. A \$2.00 processing fee is required for each kit. Thank you!

Years ago the church recognized the importance of becoming a GREEN Church, not only to save money but to help the planet. This is just a reminder of things to be done, not only in church but also in your home: turn off lights if you are last to leave a room, do not leave water running; no styrofoam (it is not biodegradable); use the recycle bin for all plastic, cans, bottles. Today, more then ever, we hear how important it is to care for our planet—let us all do our part.
