A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

"O Give thanks unto the Lord, for he is good: for his mercy endures forever" Psalm 106:1

November is here. Already some of us have begun to admire the beauty in the changing colors of the leaves. It is the time of year when we thank God for the harvest and all the blessings that come with it. Even when we have encountered the storms of life and it does not seem right or logical to offer thanks to God, we are called to be grateful. And we express our gratitude to God not just through our words but through the way we live our lives and use the resources God has entrusted to us.

On Harvest Thanksgiving Sunday (November 20), which is also the last Sunday after Pentecost, and the last Sunday of the Christian year, we will have the opportunity to pledge our support to the United Methodist Church of Hempstead for the ministries of the coming year. When we give to the church, we build the ministries that have enriched our own lives and have given us opportunities to fellowship with each other and serve our community. I pray, too, that we will be ready to respond to the needs of others and that we will always be joyful when we share our blessings and the rest of the good news with them.

District Superintendent Julia Yeon Hee Kim brings 26 years of pastoral ministry experience to her credit; 20 in ordained ministry She has served as the chairperson of District Committee on Ordained Ministry is both the L.I.E. and NY/CT districts; and has served on the Annual Conference Board.

Educational credits include a BA in psychology from Barnard College, Columbia University, and a Master of Divinity degree from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary. While in seminary, she spent two months in the Philippines doing short-term mission work.

Emigrating from Korea as a young child, DS Julia Yeon Hee Kim grew up as a pastor's child in Flushing, NY. Influenced by





You have multiplied the nation; you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as they are glad when they divide the spoil. Isaiah 9:3







Thank you to everyone who contributed time, items, and talent to make it a success!




