A Message From The Pastor's Desk



"Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise. Give thanks to him, bless his name. Be thankful unto him and bless his name." (Psalm 100:4, 5)

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Soon, we will be coming together with family and friends to give thanks to God for all his bounty on that special day we have come to know as Thanksgiving Day. We will not be alone in this, for across this nation, people will gather in their houses of worship or their homes, and many will recall what God has done for them. Things were a little different in Old Testament times, during the reign of King Solomon about 3,000 years ago. There was only one temple in all the land of Israel. Most people traveled long distances to reach Jerusalem, so going to the temple to present offerings and sacrifices to God was a special event.

Thanksgiving Day in the United States began as a day of fasting and praying. American history tells us that it originated in 1621 when the English Pilgrim founders of the colony of Plymouth had a celebration with Native Americans who brought gifts of food as a way of showing friendship. There is no evidence that those who participated in this feast thought of it as a thanksgiving celebration. However, a couple of years later, as these Pilgrims had a day of fasting and prayer to end a period of drought, this day became a day of thanksgiving to God because rains came during their prayers.

Some two centuries or so later, President Lincoln proclaimed the last Thursday in November to be a day of thanksgiving and praise to God for all God's blessings in the midst of the Civil War. With time, this day became



a home and family holiday where thanks were given to God for all of God's favors and mercies.

What are some of the things for which we can give thanks? In some form or other, we have incomes to support ourselves. We have warm houses to shelter us from the elements. We have food on our tables, and clothes on our backs. We have family or friends with whom we can share life's joys and sorrows.

Truly, God has been gracious to each of us. God loves us and cares for us. We give thanks to God not just through our words but through the way we live our lives and use the gifts and other resources God has given to us. We do these things when we remember that we did not produce what we have by any special powers or wisdom of our own. The Lord is good; He continues to be faithful; therefore, let us be grateful to Him at all times.






