

Dear Sisters and Brothers,


"It is good to give thanks to the Lord, to sing praises to your name, O Most High; to declare your steadfast love in the morning, and your faithfulness by night." (Psalm 92:1, 2)

The apostle Paul declares in Philippians 4:6, 7: "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your request be known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Would we describe ourselves as persons who genuinely give thanks to the Lord? When life is moving along smoothly, when we are enjoying good health, good family relations, and satisfying work, we are likely to give thanks. It seems right to offer thanks to God when life is calm and peaceful. But what about those times when life is not so smooth, when we find ourselves confronting uncertain health, financial struggles, failure or loss?

Paul says give thanks in all circumstances. But at times it is just too painful or too difficult to say "thank you, God."

One of our traditional hymns for Thanksgiving was written by a German pastor named Martin Rinkart (1586-1649). Amid the darkness of the Thirty Years' War, this pastor is said to have buried 5,000 of his parishioners in



one year–an average of 13 or 14 a day. His parish was ravaged by war, death, and economic disaster. His wife was among those whom he buried. In the heart of the darkness, with the cries of fear outside his window, he sat down and wrote the following table grace for his children:

"Now thank we all our God, with heart and hands and voices; Who wondrous things hath done, in whom His world rejoices; Who from our mothers' arms has blessed us on our way With countless gifts of love and still is ours today." (Translated by Catherine Winkworth, 1858)

We are truly blessed. Let us show our appreciation to God for his faithfulness in our lives.
