A Message From The Pastor's Desk

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

"Be hospitable to one another without complaining. Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God serve one another with whatever gift each of you have received." (1 Peter 4:9-10)

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

I greet you again in the precious name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

This past July, I went on an incredible community service trip to Udon Thami, Thailand. I stayed for two weeks with a group of high school students from across North America and Europe, and worked on various projects that both supported the people of the region and helped me better understand Thai culture. Three were construction-based projects; one in which we built a house for a woman with epilepsy and her children; in a second, we helped build a playground outside a pre-school, and the last, in which we helped construct an organic garden outside an elementary school. There were also teaching-based projects. In the first, we taught English to grade school students; the second, we taught children how to swim. This was important because drowning in flooded rice paddies is a leading cause of death among rural Thai children. The third was a group of high school Thai students who worked on projects with us and learned English along the way.

The last project group we worked on involved economic support. In the first, we assisted a middle-aged woman and her son in planting rice in an enormous field. In another, we delivered freshly cooked meals to village people and family members of people who were sick in a local hospital. On the last, we cleaned a Buddhist temple and talked with the monks about their lifestyle.

Although the people of the region live poor and simple lives, they were some of the friendliest and happiest people I've ever met, and I'm happy I was able to make a small improvement to their conditions. The trip was definitely one of the best experiences of my life. I grew to have a great appreciation of Thailand and its culture, while learning some of the language and customs during my stay. I'm glad I was able to make connections with local people, even if it meant smiling at them.



I'm also happy with the friendships I made with all the students that were on the trip with me. I hope to stay connected with them and meet them again in the future.

What was also exciting was that I was able to experience a bonus trip one weekend where I visited the neighboring country of Laos, learning more about a new culture and making unforget-table memories.

Overall, the trip gave me a better understanding of the world and how good it is to help others.

Ghurch Revival Raises Spirits


