


Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Greetings in the precious name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

This past June, during the reading of appointments at the New York Annual Conference (NYAC) of the United Methodist Church's Session at Hofstra University, pastors were made aware that their churches were assigned to particular areas known as Cooperative Parishes. These parishes replaced what used to be called Clusters. The element of surprise was the announcement of some pastors as Coordinators of these newly-formed Cooperative Parishes. Recently, I received a memo from Bishop Thomas J. Bickerton, Resident Bishop of the New York Area. In the memo, Bishop Bickerton expressed gratitude to pastors (including myself) for agreeing to become one of the new Cooperative Parishes Coordinators in the NYAC and shared his "excitement about providing this new framework for leadership development, strategic thinking, peer-to-peer learning, and potential cooperative ministry development with our Annual Conference." More information about the above would be made available to you in the next issue of the Parish News.

Summer has unofficially ended. For the most part, schools, colleges, and other institutions of learning are getting back in full swing. Also, churches have resumed or are on the verge of resuming their various ministries from which they had taken a break. I pray that this would be a productive year for everyone.



(Interfaith Nutrition Network) and UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief). As Christians, Jesus taught us to feed the hungry.
